From 1 January 2011, the south east region of South Australia covered by the Limestone Coast Division of General Practice will commence a transition process whereby Sturt Fleurieu, based in Strathalbyn, will become the primary provider of the AGPT program. Through 2010 Greater Green Triangle GP Education and Training (GGT) based in Warrnambool and getGP based in Gippsland will merge. Sturt Fleurieu and the new merged GGT/getGP will implement transitional arrangements to facilitate the expansion of the Sturt Fleurieu training footprint into the south east of South Australia starting January 2011.

By Dec 2011, however, medical practices in the south east South Australia will be given the opportunity to nominate the ongoing RTP for the delivery of the AGPT.

Through 2011, the south east of South Australia region will be shared in the delivery of AGPT by Sturt Fleurieu and GGT/getGP.

Medical practices will be asked to have a preference of GPT1/2 registrars from Sturt Fleurieu but have the option of accepting GGT/getGP registrars during 2011.

Medical practices can accept GPT 3/4 registrars from either RTP.

In association with the teaching practices and regional supervisors, Sturt Fleurieu will provide a regional learning node based in the south east South Australia.

GGT/getGP will continue to provide training in the south east for its GPT 1/2 registrars for 2011.
